We have new magnets to promote the service available – please take one from local outlets – phone number, email and QR code provided so you can easily jump onto the webpage and book or find out more








#### Thank you for helping us make a difference!







## Bald Hills Wind Farm Community Fund Invites Applications for its 2025 District and Small Grants

The Bald Hills Wind Farm Community Fund (BHWFCF) is inviting organisations with community projects benefiting the Tarwin Lower, Venus Bay and Walkerville districts to submit applications for its 2025 District and Small Grants.



The District grant, is a single grant valued at up to \$15,000, provides an exciting opportunity for a local organisation to develop a significant project to benefit the district community.

The Small Grants, which will be awarded up to the amount of \$2,000 or \$5,000 per project, are designed to enable organisations to provide a benefit or service to the local community.

Previous grants have funded such project as:

- Infrastructure upgrades at The Tarwin Recreational Reserve, Mechanics Hall, Men's Shed, and Venus Bay Community Centre;
- Mobility equipment for the Tarwin Lower and District Community Health Centre;
- Medical equipment for the Venus Bay & District Community Emergency Centre and Tarwin Lower Mechanical Institute;
- IT resources and infrastructure improvements for the Tarwin Lower Primary School;
- Arts projects such as the Venus Bay Water Tank Mural project and the Thirsty Works Gallery; and assistance to the Tarwin Wildlife Shelter, Watch for Wildlife and Community Bee Keeping.

### lives this summer

WAS all hands on deck as first responders gathered at Venus Bay to perfect their response to drowning emergencies.

Staff and volunteers from Ambulance Victoria (AV), Life Saving Victoria and Com-munity Emergency Response Team (CERT) gathered on Sunday, November 24 at the Venus Bay Surf Life Saving Club for a critical training exercise where they would rescue two drowning patients from the water.

And to make the response even more realistic. members were unaware of what they would be responding to, explained Rebecca Quarrier AV team manager (acting), Mirboo North and Venus Bay CERT.

She highlighted the training session was a chance for members to refresh and fine-tune their skills before the busy summer period.

And given the tragic drownings that occurred earlier this year across Bass Coast, the

importance of the exercise can't be understated.

Responders practised res-cuing patient one (an adult man) who was 'near drown-ing' and patient two (manikin), which was a young child who was 'drowning'. With careful guidance from

instructors, responders went through all the motions involved in extricating and resuscitating patients.

Ultimately. the proved to be a success, but it is hoped they won't have to put the training into practice this summer.

The Bass Coast and South Gippsland coastline some of the most dangerous beaches with a 2017 report highlighting Bass Coast as a beach drowning blackspot.

Bass Coast Shire had also ranked the second highest Local Government Area in Victoria for fatal drowning events.

Earlier this year, there had been strong calls for better signage across dangerous beaches in Bass Coast

The Strategy proposes bold actions such as the removal of coastal township greenfield areas from the planning scheme and restricting development to one dwelling per lot in sensitive coastal areas.
