Bald Hills Wind Farm Community Fund Invites Applications for its 2025 District and Small Grants



The Bald Hills Wind Farm Community Fund (BHWFCF) is inviting organisations with community projects benefiting the Tarwin Lower, Venus Bay and Walkerville districts to submit applications for its 2025 District and Small Grants.

The District grant, is a single grant valued at up to \$15,000, provides an exciting opportunity for a local organisation to develop a significant project to benefit the district community.

The Small Grants, which will be awarded up to the amount of \$2,000 or \$5,000 per project, are designed to enable organisations to provide a benefit or service to the local community.

Previous grants have funded such project as:

- Infrastructure upgrades at The Tarwin Recreational Reserve, Mechanics Hall, Men's Shed, and Venus Bay Community Centre;
- Mobility equipment for the Tarwin Lower and District Community Health Centre;
- Medical equipment for the Venus Bay & District Community Emergency Centre and Tarwin Lower Mechanical Institute;
- IT resources and infrastructure improvements for the Tarwin Lower Primary School;
- Arts projects such as the Venus Bay Water Tank Mural project and the Thirsty Works Gallery; and assistance to the Tarwin Wildlife Shelter, Watch for Wildlife and Community Bee Keeping.

Grant applications will be available from 18/21 November 2023 until the closing date of 5pm 02 April 2024.

New Public Rescue Equipment Launched at Venus Bay to Improve Beach Safety

Life Saving Victoria (LSV) and Venus Bay Surf Life Saving Club (SLSC) have officially launched Public Rescue Equipment (PRE) stations at Venus Bay today, a trial initiative aimed at preventing drownings and addressing incidents where bystanders attempting rescue tragically become victims themselves.

Venus Bay, located in South Gippsland, was chosen for this trial due to its status as a high-risk drowning location and was selected following a comprehensive coastal risk assessment and community consultation with both permanent and part-time residents.

The trial will see PRE stations installed across Venus Bay beaches No.1 to No.5. Each station includes:

- An emergency call button that connects to Triple Zero (000).
- A rescue tube (flotation device).
- Instructional signage to advise steps to take during emergencies.
- An emergency marker for location identification.
- A QR code offering language support and further information.

LSV Head of Research, Evaluation and Insights, Dr Bernadette Matthews, emphasised the importance of this initiative in addressing preventable drownings.

"While we urge everyone to swim between the red and yellow flags, at a patrolled location, we recognise that unpatrolled locations remain popular, and bystanders often feel compelled to assist during emergencies," Dr. Matthews said.

"This trial ensures emergency support is just a call away and provides accessible safety equipment for those with the skills to use it, helping to reduce risks for both rescuers and those in trouble." The program's goals are clear: to provide vital tools to improve safety at unpatrolled locations, boost community awareness, and evaluate the effectiveness of PRE for potential use in other high-risk drowning areas across Victoria.

The initiative is proudly funded by the Australian Government through Surf Life Saving Australia's Beach Drowning Blackspot Reduction Program and highlights the collective commitment of government, local communities, and lifesaving organisations to prevent drowning fatalities.

"The launch of public rescue equipment stations at Venus Bay reinforces the importance of water safety awareness and ensures beachgoers have access to resources that can make a difference," Dr. Matthews added.



As the summer season heats up, Life Saving Victoria urges everyone to download the Beachsafe App to find the nearest patrolled beach.

Venus Bay SLSC and the wider Venus Bay community have all played a critical role in supporting this life-saving initiative.

Former Venus Bay SLSC President Paul Hoffman, who led the project locally, said many in the Venus Bay community had put in an immense effort to make the stations a reality.

"It's a huge relief and peace of mind for the life saving club and the community," Mr Hoffman said.

"It's a big sense of achievement to be able to offer an extra level of protection."

KNOWYOUR BINS

Residents in Venus Bay have a compulsory garbage and recycling collection service which runs for six months of the year from 1 November to 30 April each year. An opt-in 12 month service is also available. The service includes a 120L garbage bin collected weekly and a 240L recycling bin collected fortnightly. Weekly recycling collections will be provided from Christmas Day through until the end of January each year.

What items can go in my bins?
