

Mycelia Energy Collective & VBCC Mycelia Making Energy Goals a Reality



The Venus Bay Community Centre and Mycelia Renewables have partnered-up to collaborate on the delivery of the Venus Bay Community Energy Action Plan. That' right - partnerships, plans and action! Hooray! But what does this actually mean?

It means that we'll start rolling out some opportunities to make our community energy plan a reality!

For starters, we are adopting the Mycelia Energy Collective model. The model was designed to support a fair transition to renewable energy, ensuring that everyone can share in the benefits of the energy transition. It also provides a way for us to use our energy bills to build and grow a community fund.

But, to be more explicit, the Mycelia Energy Collective does five things:

- 1. Offers a low-cost energy deal to households and businesses.
 - a. Anyone can join, and the rates are really good! You can check them out <u>here, get a quote, or sign up in 5 minutes</u>. It's very easy and they'll move your old bill over for you.
- 2. One dollar a week from each person goes into a community-benefit fund to use for our local energy goals.
- 3. Knowledge-sharing and community events to share information and ideas.
- 4. Opportunities for more community-owned renewable energy installations, including bulk buys for households.
- 5. Mycelia's Energy Efficiency Homes Program, which includes Household Energy Efficiency Assessments and Upgrades and Group Learning Courses.



We all throw out stuff.

You know those moments – when something you own passes its expiry date.

The moths have had a field day on your favourite top. That t-shirt, so smelly that it walks out of your cupboard. That shirt so splattered with egg, toothpaste, red sauce or paint stains that it looks like an abstract painting. Cups with busted handles or books covered in chocolate and jam fingerprints. All these things that are now sadly of no use to you or to anyone else.

However, for some of our discarded items there is a different story. Sometimes the things we get rid of are in near perfect condition. It's just that our own personal story is changing and as a result we are clearing out things that are now unwanted and even unused. Like when all of your seven kids leave home and you downsize. Or you've decided to sell the house and travel around Australia in a caravan. Maybe you started wearing florals and all your tops are polka dots or your feet grew or maybe it was your belly.

The large volume of goods that pass through the Venus Bay Community Centre (VBCC) Recycle Op Shop from donation through to sales just goes to show how much movement is in people's lives. Things continually shifting and changing. Clearing and rebuilding, moving and reinventing.

Our Volunteers are amazing at processing all of the items that are donated - so that you might discover that perfect precious,





'just what I was looking for' item.

Of importance to VBCC is lengthening the life of items on their way to landfill. In particular clothing, did you know the fashion industry is one of the main contributors to the landfill dilemma?

We continue to be amazed by the quality of goods that pass through the store. Things that still have price tags on them, designer label clothing and shoes, hi end electrical gear, crockery, giftware, toys, books and more.

The speed that things come in and then move on is gratifying to not only VBCC but also the volunteers that put in many hours helping. Seeing good quality items being given a second home and keeping

items out of land fill is very rewarding for all parties including the person who donated the item. For example one of our volunteers shared a story of her daughter who after years of being a full time mother started a job as a lawyer. She was fully outfitted via the Recycle Centre.

So maybe next time you are in town you want to play tennis at the Tarwin Lower tennis court, chances are we have tennis rackets available, or golf sticks for a round of golf, or a bike for the holiday house. If the weather turns cold you are guaranteed to find a warm jumper and coat along with a good book or a handful of movies.

In turn your purchase will be contributing to local employment, reducing landfill, helping to provide free wifi (which you can use), helping to pay for free community lunches, the annual Santa party and presents and the Summer beach bus and now the new E-Bus service as well as many other projects in Venus Bay and the local area.

Cr. Gilligan's July update.

Hi all, many thanks to all of the lovely messages of support and care over the recent death of my father, known nationally as the "father of emergency medical retrieval" he truly was a trailblazer, a wonderful dad and friend. I got back just in time for a healing winter solstice swim with this bunch of brave "not so skinny" dippers, it's good to be back!



I am so impressed with the rise of the **Not So Skinny Dippers** and **Wombat Walkers**, two great community groups who are a mix of full and part timers coming together to take advantage of this incredibly beautiful part of the world in a healthy proactive way huzzah!

Its been a busy time catching up on all things council, the biggest being the **final budget of our council term**. Another **important plan up for public consultation now** is our <u>Waste and Resource Recovery Plan</u>. In waste there are a number of things coming our way beyond council's control, the whole state will be introducing a compulsory FOGO service for example, a three bin full time system will apply to all. Locally we are on our last landfill cell, it's crunch time for waste management planning in South Gippy.

Council's plan incorporates these and more mandatory statewide changes whilst looking to a longerterm future that embraces **local** waste innovation, circular economy principles and recognises the importance of changing consumption and waste behaviours as key. As communities we absolutely need to generate less waste, whilst dealing with the waste we have in a sustainable way to reduce landfill, C02 emissions and all the nasties.

Off the back of speaking at the Australian Coastal Council Association's annual conference in May I'm off to Canberra this week to meet with the Assistant Minister for Climate Change and Energy and a couple of key policy advisors to push for a funded federal Coastal Adaptation strategy and minister for the Coast. With 50 percent of Australians living withing 7km of our coastline its a gap that needs filling and fast. I will be joining Mornington, East Gippsland and Moyne councils in this representation, wish me luck!

Upcoming Council Elections – make sure you get a vote! The Victorian Electoral Commision (VEC) have wiped the slate clean for the 2024 council elections; if you have received postal votes in the past you won't this time unless you are a permanent resident OR you have enrolled on the council list before the end of July. Enrolment takes two minutes to complete. The VEC also confirmed the implementation of proposed ward boundary changes for South Gippsland. There was only one model suggested and what it has done is increase the Coastal Prom Ward to include many more towns including Meenyian, Fish Creek, Stony Creek, Dumbalk, Buffalo and more. Welcome all, I may not think it make sense but it is a great bunch of communities into the fold!


The premise behind this adjustment is that each ward maintains an even number of voters per Councillor, however **the data only counts the full time populations and assumes only a tiny percentage of our part time population would want to participate in local council elections.** As a very involved part timer who became a full timer and then a councillor I do not believe this to be true!!

We all know the official population numbers are tricky to nail down in tourism towns, since the normalization of Covid and WFH capabilities we not only have more full timers than the Census data reflects but part timers spending the majority of their time each week with us, the part timer life is no longer predominantly as a weekender. The way we work in the world has changed and our population data collection hasn't.

Our part time and visitor population are also often hard to reach so PLEASE help me in letting every rate payer across the shire know to enrol or re-enrol in the upcoming council elections by the end of July. Lets set the record straight and give Coastal communities representation in the data that reflects reality.

Application forms have been mailed out to all 7000 non-resident ratepayers in South Gippsland, they need to be completed and lodged with Council by the end of July. If you didn't get one or can't find it:



Art Project healing country – 'Reclaim the Void'

The Community Centre often hears about some great projects happening both locally and in other areas. 'Reclaim the Void – weaving country whole' is one of those.

According the their website (<u>https://www.reclaimthevoid.com.au/</u>) the concept of Reclaim the Void came directly from the Ngalia elders who expressed their pain and grief at 'those gaping mining holes left all over our country.' It was decided to create a huge 'dot' artwork to lay on the land. A call was put out across Australia for people to create hand woven rugs from discarded fabric.

The project received support from people across Australia and around the world. Many schools also took on the opportunity to be involved. Each person was asked to create a circular woven rug to contribute. When the rugs were finished they were sent to Denmark in Western Australia to be joined together to create the final piece. In addition participants were asked to submit a few words with their piece.

A Venus Bay local, Terrie, was inspired to become involved in the project and managed to complete two fabulous woven rugs from discarded materials donated to the Recycle Shop.

Terrie has kindly let us share here story.

My story

What a fantastic project.

I was immediately drawn to the project and while I live in a small coastal community in south east Australia, I have travelled across and around Australia nad witnessed those gaping mining holes. I can truly appreciate the pain and grief they have caused.

I became aware of Reclaim the Void towards the end of the allotted time for dot making. There was little time for weaving but I was keen to be part of the community working towards weaving country whole. My contributions is small but it is from the heart.

I live in Venus Bay, Victoria. It is a small coastal community in the south east of Australia. The landscape is predominately green. The reds and yellows I chose weave with reminded me of the

beautiful warm earthy colours I remember of central Australia.

The fabric I used for weaving was donated by the Venus Bay Community Centre Recycle Centre. It's a wonderful enterprise that aims to reduce and delay all manner of items going to landill and like Reclaim the Void, the Community Centre supports and advocates on a range of issues that are important to the Community.

It is an honour to participate in this project, to help create this special artwork that will be laid on Ngalia tjukurrpa parna country. I look forward to seeing the project in its entirety, transformed into a symbol of hope and healing of country and community.
